Featuring the one-star review, "The Lack of Wildlife is Alarming," taken from a real Yosemite visitor, Subpar Pale Ale intends to remind consumers to get outside and have a superb Subpar Earth Day.

Frank Lloyd Wright famously said, "nature will never fail you" well, Subpar Pale Ale highlights the outdoor "enthusiasts" who seem to think otherwise. Inspired by the wild berries within the parks, this year's limited-time beer is brewed with red currant, raspberries, and Mosaic hops to create a balanced Pale Ale that's slightly sweet and a little bitter, just like your favorite one-star reviews. In honor of the "uninspiring" wildlife, New Belgium is proud to support the National Wildlife Federation's conservation with the release of Subpar Pale Ale.

Born that day was the mantra <u>we inspire environmental change</u>, honoring Earth's natural resources to brew beer and power us as humans. Keeping to that promise, New Belgium became a certified B Corporation in 2012, was the 1st wind-powered brewery in the United States, developed the 1st carbon-neutral footprint study for beer, released the country's first certified carbon-neutral beer, and remains a vocal advocate for policy change in the arena of climate action. Each year, coworkers enjoy Earth Day as a paid holiday, encouraging them to get outside and, this year, maybe even enjoy the wildlife in their natural habitats.
